



REMEMBER!-

Upskilling – the process of learning new skills or teaching workers additional skills in order to perform their current job more effectively, efficiently, or in a more modern manner.

Reskilling – the process of learning new skills so employees can do a different job. For example: a data entry specialist with strong technical skills may be chosen to be reskilled into a data analyst role.

USEFUL HINT! -

Work is what you do to earn money. The noun **work** is more general than "job".

Work is an uncountable noun, so it can't be used in the plural:

I have four works to do this week.

I have four **projects** to do this week.

I have four **things / tasks** to do this week.

I have four **assignments** to do this week.

A **job** is the particular type of work that you do. It is also called a **profession** or an **occupation** and is countable.

John has got **a job** as a waiter.

Mary has had **five jobs** in the past four years.
